The Norfolk Field Naturalists organization is dedicated to the acquisition and extension of knowledge of natural history and the appreciation, enjoyment and stewardship of natural environment, especially within the Counties of Norfolk and Haldimand. Established in 1962, NFN celebrated its 40th year in 2002.

NFN members participate in monthly meetings from September to May. Guest speakers present programs on interesting and relevant natural history and conservation topics. Field outings are held throughout the year with trips of local interest and significance. Junior naturalists are encouraged to participate with their families. Annual membership is \$20 Individual or \$30 for a Family. Donations to the NFN are appreciated; charitable receipts are issued for amounts exceeding \$10.00.

NFN has always taken leadership in public education and protection of our local natural treasures; actions taken include participation in recovery teams for various species at risk, restoration and preservation of habitat, participation in annual bird and butterfly counts and acting in an advisory capacity to local authorities and environmental planning groups.

Club members receive the Lotus, a newsletter with articles on our local history and club activities. The NFN has taken an active role in protecting local areas of natural significance by participating in planning exercises and helping other groups raise funds for land acquisition.

Directors are chosen / elected from the membership for a term of 1-3 years, renewed annually, and normally limited to a period of six years' consecutive service. One Honorary President and one or two Honorary Directors may be appointed by the Board in recognition of long and outstanding service to the NFN; they may be called upon by the Board to act in an advisory capacity. There is no limitation on the length of service in the honorary positions.

President's Report

2008 - 2009

Over the past year the Norfolk Field Naturalists continued to be proactive and effective in carrying out our mission of furthering the study, appreciation and conservation of our natural world. The indoor meeting program featured 8 excellent speakers on a wide range of topics, and also a dinner and movie night. In addition there were monthly field outings which were generally well attended except on various occasions when the weather didn't cooperate. The Club continued to sponsor two Christmas Bird Counts and a July Butterfly count. Data from these counts are contributed to international databases.

All NFN events were open to members and non-members alike. The community was kept informed of our events through our brochure, website, and local media. The NFN display was used at several events in our community. As a result, we increased awareness of our organization and gained several new members over the past year.

Unfortunately, we also lost some long term NFN members who had over the years made major contributions to our organization, our community, and our natural environment including:

- 1 **Doug Jenereaux** who was a dedicated volunteer often helping staff the NFN booth at the Fair and actively involved in various conservation projects.
- 2 **Mike Nemeroski** also was an active volunteer with a particular interest in trees specifically the endangered American Chestnut tree and he was very involved in efforts to develop blight-resistant native chestnut trees.

NFN was an active participant in several collaborative projects this past year. We heard tonight about one of these projects, the Great Tree Hunt. NFN partnered with the Long Point Basin Land Trust in 2009 to manage invasive plants that are impacting natural habitats at various areas in South Walsingham including the club's Rowanwood Sanctuary. Funding for that project was provided by the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources Species at Risk Stewardship Fund. This year we also partnered with the Long Point World Biosphere Reserve Foundation to launch a local chapter of the Kids for Turtle program. This new project fills the gap left by the lack of an NFN's youth program and will help develop a new generation of naturalists.

Our achievements over the past year are the result of the contributions and dedication of many, many people. I'd like to say **Thank You** to:

Externally restricted funds - By agreement with the Ontario Heritage Foundation, NFN is the custodian and manager of this 97-acre reserve. The income from this GIC is used for the ongoing costs such as taxes, insurance and upkeep.

(B) Securement and Protection: Balance: 25,878

Funds committed to acquisition or protection of new nature reserves. These funds are retained over several years until enough resources are available for a targeted purchase/project.

Funds for educational programs and materials for youth.
